In addition to the foregoing holidays, the Resident Circuit Judge of a county in the 24th Judicial Circuit may declare a court holiday in that county when the court facilities are otherwise closed for the observance of a holiday not listed above. In the event the court facilities in a county in the 24th Judicial Circuit are to remain open on one or more of the foregoing holidays, the Resident Circuit Judge of the county in which that situation occurs may disregard the above listed holiday and declare the court open on that day.

All matters returnable on any court holiday shall be continued to the next business day of the court. The time for filing all motions and pleadings due to be filed on any holiday shall be extended to the next business day of the court.
